When we consider that the carcasses of half a million animals are annually condemned in the United States as unfit for human food on account of the presence of extensive lesions of contagious disease, we may realize how important it is to limit in every way possible the prevalence of such disease in food-producing animals and thereby to reduce this great waste. The work of the Department of Animal Industry bears an important relation also to the maintenance and protection of the public health by its activities in suppression of such animal diseases as are communicable to the human subject, namely, glanders, tuberculosis, rabies, anthrax, actinomycosis, etc. Any one of these diseases may be transmitted to persons if circumstances favorable to such transmission are present, and we find that a certain toll of human life is annually exacted by them. Our work in supervision of the health of animals may therefore be classed as auxiliary to that of the public health service, and if efficient is of positive value to the general public welfare.
